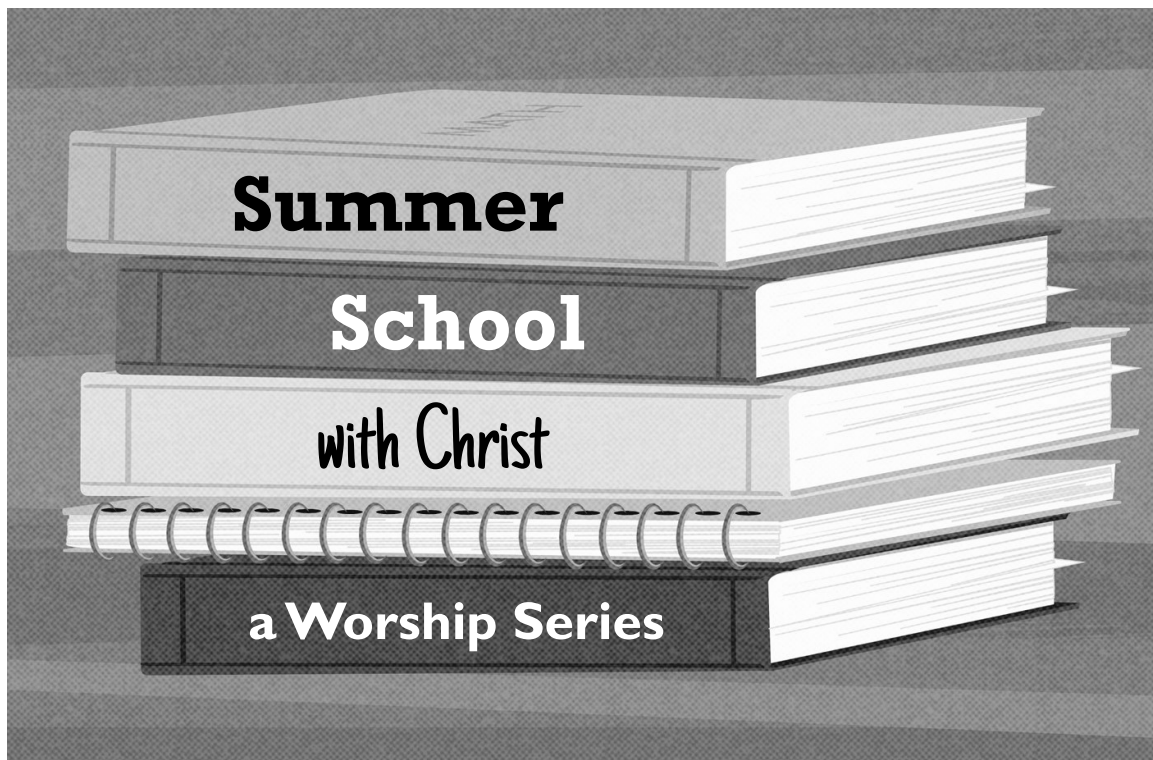

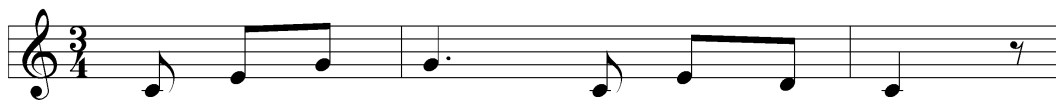

## PRAYER

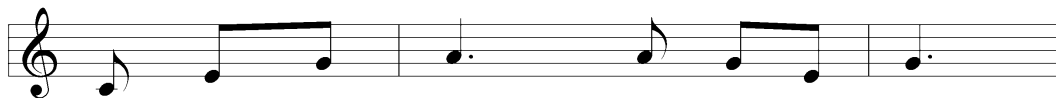

## LESSON 8: Connect with Jesus through the Lord's Supper

"The Sacraments therefore, are not chiefly pledges of the believer's loyalty, but of God's loyalty. They do not testify to the earnestness of the convert, but to the earnestness of God in saving and keeping his people by His grace.

"This was a difficult concept for me, since I was raised in circles where we believed that the significance of baptism and the Lord's Supper was to stir us into response. In other words, it was the emotion or piety these actions elicited, NOT the heavenly gifts that God was giving to me through these means, that defined the moment.

"Baptism meant, 'I have decided to follow Jesus.' The Lord's Supper meant, 'I remember how much Jesus went through and how much I should therefore do for him.' Both the preaching and these ceremonies focused on my intense subjective experience and resolve to do better, rather than on God and his objective grace in Christ. These activities were little more than object lessons for my personal piety." — Michael Horton

**Luke 17:20-21** <sup>20</sup> Once, on being asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, Jesus replied, "The coming of the kingdom of God is not something that can be observed, <sup>21</sup> nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is in your midst."

**Luke 10:23-24** <sup>23</sup> Then he turned to his disciples and said privately, "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see. <sup>24</sup> For I tell you that many prophets and kings wanted to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it."

**Hebrews 9:15** <sup>15</sup> For this reason Christ is the mediator of a new covenant, that those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance—now that he has died as a ransom to set them free from the sins committed under the first covenant...<sup>22</sup> In fact, the law requires that nearly everything be cleansed with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness.

**Jeremiah 31:31–34** <sup>31</sup> “The days are coming,” declares the Lord, “when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah. <sup>32</sup> It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them,” declares the Lord. <sup>33</sup> “This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time,” declares the Lord. “I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. <sup>34</sup> No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, ‘Know the Lord,’ because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest,” declares the Lord. “For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more.”
