OLD TESTAMENT LESSON *Joshua 24: 15-18*

GOSPEL LESSON *John 6: 60-69*

On hearing it, many of his disciples said, “This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?”

Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this, Jesus said to them, “Does this offend you? Then what if you see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before! The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you—they are full of the Spirit and life. Yet there are some of you who do not believe.” For Jesus had known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him. He went on to say, “This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless the Father has enabled them.”

From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him.

“You do not want to leave too, do you?” Jesus asked the Twelve.

Simon Peter answered him, “Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God.”



CONFIRMATION VOWS

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, our Lord Jesus said to his disciples: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

In obedience to the Lord's command, you have been baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. You have been taught the precious truths of the Christian faith as confessed by the Evangelical Lutheran Church. You know what God has given you by his grace and what he expects of you as his dear child. You now have the privilege of receiving the Lord's body and blood in the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

You are here to make a public profession of your Christian faith. The apostle Paul, writing to the Romans, said: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Therefore, lift up your hearts to the God of all grace and joyfully answer these questions.

Do you this day, in the presence of God and of this congregation, acknowledge that in Baptism, God gave you forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation? (*I do.*)

P: Do you reject the devil along with all his lies and empty promises? *(I do.)*

Do you believe in God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit?

(spoken by the confirmands)

*I believe in God, the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth*

*I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended into hell.
The third day he rose again from the dead.
He ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty.
From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.*

*I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Holy Christian Church,
the communion of saints,

and the life everlasting. Amen.*

P: Do you believe all the books of the Bible to be the inspired Word of God? *(I do.)*

Do you believe that the teaching of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, as you have learned to know it from Luther's Small Catechism, is faithful and true to the Word of God? *(I do.)*

Do you intend to continue steadfast in this teaching and to endure all things, even death, rather than fall away from it? *(I do, and I ask God to help me.)*

Do you intend to conform all your life to the teachings of God's Word, to be faithful in the use of the Word and sacrament, and in faith and action remain true to God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—as long as you live? *(I do, and I ask God to help me.)*

Since it is God alone who enables us both to will and to do his good pleasure, it is right for us, dear friends in Christ, to call on him for these confirmands, that he would graciously complete the good work which he has begun in them. Let us, therefore, bow our heads and pray.

P: Lord God, heavenly Father, we thank and praise you for your great goodness in bringing these sons and daughters of yours to the knowledge of your Son, Jesus Christ, and in giving them both hearts to believe and mouths to confess his saving name. Enable them to bring forth the fruits of faith and to continue steadfast and victorious until the day comes when all who have fought the good fight of faith shall receive the crown of righteousness, through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.







Welcome!

On this Confirmation Sunday, we give special thanks to God for the eternal blessings received through his Word. Through his precious Word and Sacraments, God works faith in our hearts and strengthens and sustains it. If you are visiting, please sign the guest book in the gathering area and come back and worship with us soon! After signing the guest book, you are invited to join us for a cup of coffee or juice and refreshments after the Sunday morning service. We are happy to have you worship with us today. Please pick up a copy of our May newsletter, *The Crownical*. You'll find copies on the kiosk in the gathering area.

Today is Confirmation Sunday! This year seven students were examined in the fundamental teachings of Scripture in the first service. In the late service, they will make vows of faithfulness to their Savior and receive the Lord's Supper for the first time. The students being confirmed today are: **Grace Erdman, Olivia Fladhammer, Katharine Gund, Alaina Harper, Owen Kauffeld, Aydan Pratt, and Elijah Zirbel.** Take the time to encourage our students and welcome them as newly confirmed members of our church. Please keep these young people in your prayers.

The Lord's Supper: Friends, you are welcome in the name of the Lord, who has done great things for us! One of those great things is the giving of his body and blood in Holy Communion. Because of the Bible's witness that true faith in Christ is central to its common reception, we kindly ask that visitors who desire to commune speak with one of the pastors before the service.

Baptism: Benjamin Michael Stelse, son of Kyle & Kim Stelse, was baptized in our 8:00 am Sunday service. Pray that this young child will grow in the love and wisdom of our Savior.

Available Services: There are restrooms in the coatroom area and the parents' room. Hearing Assistive Devices are available from an usher. We have both ear buds and loop FM receivers for those with hearing aids. Our ushers are glad to provide large print bulletins for those who need them.

Attention Parents: If you need a place to take a crying or noisy child during the service, you may use the parents' room adjacent to the sanctuary. You can hear and view the service there. You will find a diaper changing station in the parents' room and in both restrooms located in the coatroom area.

A Reception for our Confirmands will be held after this service. All are invited to attend, to welcome and encourage our confirmands, and to enjoy some refreshments.

An Explanation of a Lutheran Confirmation Service

The Procession: The confirmands walking down the aisle at the beginning of the service is symbolic. They are not walking into an ordinary building. They are entering a place where, in a few minutes, they will confess their faith in God. They are entering into God's infinitely holy presence. Their actions show respect and humility.

The White Robe: The white robes worn by the confirmands are symbolic. They are a reminder of Christian holiness and sinlessness in the sight of our Creator. Every Lutheran confirmand knows that such sinlessness is not obtained by anything that he or she does. The confirmands know from personal experience, as well as from Scripture, that every imagination of the thoughts of their hearts is only evil. They know there is no natural goodness within them. They cannot become sinless. But, by God's grace and mercy, they learned that Christ bore their sins in his own body on the cross; that he was wounded for their transgressions; that he was bruised for their iniquities; that the chastisement, which produced their peace, was upon him; and that with his stripes they are healed (Isaiah 53). Those who believe that Jesus Christ is their Savior, who cleansed them from all their sins, realize that the white robe is a symbol of their righteousness before God.

The Bended Knee: When the confirmands kneel in the presence of God, they are thereby proclaiming before all the world that God is above them, that they are his own, and that his precepts are the principles by which he wishes to direct their lives.

The Laying on of the Hands (The Blessing): The pastor lays his hand upon each confirmand's head and solemnly blesses each. Then, he proclaims a Scripture passage for each confirmand, which is designed to guide the individual Christian through the future. Thus, the confirmand is graced with both a general and a specific blessing pronounced by the pastor in the name of the church

The Handclasp (The Promise): Such loyalty to Christ, both in what a person believes and in the way he or she lives, must remain constant, even unto death. The individual is already a Christian at the time of her Confirmation. But this means nothing unless she remains a Christian until her life is finished here on earth. Only those, "who stand firm to the end will be saved" (Matthew 24:13). This is what the handclasp symbolizes in the presence of God and the assembled witnesses. It is a pledge of her promise to renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways, to remain true to the teachings of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and to live as it becomes the Gospel of Christ all the days of her life.

Bible Studies

Bible Information Class: Review the fundamental teachings of the Christian faith as revealed in the Bible. This is an excellent class for anyone interested in becoming a member of our church and a good refresher course for members. Class meets weekly on Saturdays at 3:30 pm, Sundays at 9:10 am, Mondays at 5:30 pm, and Wednesdays at 5:30 pm. Please contact Pastor Warnecke if you have any questions.

The Gospel of John Bible Study is held on Sundays at 9:10 am in the downstairs fellowship hall. We start with a Bible-based video and then discuss that section of scripture.

Sunday School, Teen Bible Study, and Adult Sunday School will not meet during the summer. They will begin meeting again on Sunday, September 9.

The Early Risers Bible Study is studying “God Still Reigns” (1 Kings). Over time God’s Word was neglected, and wicked kings and false prophets tolerated and supported false worship. Yet some kings were faithful, and true prophets called people back to worship in truth. All are welcome to join us on Tuesdays at 8:00 am in the library.

The 19-Minute Bible Study is offered following both of our Wednesday services. Beginning at approximately 12:45 and 7:45 pm we will meet for 19 minutes in the library to grow in our faith and knowledge of God’s Word together.

The Enduring Word Bible Study is held on Thursdays at 9:00 am in the library. They are studying the Gospel of Matthew—God’s Promises Realized!
