Prepare for next week's focus, The Battle, by reading Romans chapter 7 by yourself, with your family, or with a friend.


As you meditate on and consider what you read, ask yourself these questions:



GOSPEL LESSON *John 8: 31-38*

To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, “If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.”

They answered him, “We are Abraham’s descendants and have never been slaves of anyone. How can you say that we shall be set free?”

Jesus replied, “Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed. I know that you are Abraham’s descendants. Yet you are looking for a way to kill me, because you have no room for my word. I am telling you what I have seen in the Father’s presence, and you are doing what you have heard from your father.”

SERMON TEXT *Romans 6: 1-11*

What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! We are those who have died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin—because anyone who has died has been set free from sin.

Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over

him. The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God.

In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Brother in Need

Tom & Sharon Clements have been members at Christ for 8 years, married for 26 years, and have two daughters, Shaina and Brandi. For over 25 years, Tom faithfully served as a fireman and EMT responder in Waukesha, Merton and Milwaukee. Tom developed painful arthritis in both hips which has impacted every area of his life and so he has stepped down from his service roles. Tom lost his income in June 2019 and also his health insurance benefits. His first hip replacement surgery in June impacted a major nerve in his hip area, and his leg may never function normally again. His second hip replacement is in jeopardy of being postponed until the year 2020. Tom continues rehab and uses a wheelchair. His wife, Sharon, is not able to work outside of the home at this time. She faithfully serves Tom as his full-time support person, taking care of the home, and transporting Tom to appointments every day.

Tom & Sharon trust their Lord's promises that he will cause all things in their lives to work out for their good as his children. They trust that with the Lord's and their doctors' help, Tom will have a productive, pain-free life again in time. But now, they could really use assistance with Tom's medical bills, which will exceed \$20,000 after his second surgery and rehab.
