EPISTLE LESSON *I Corinthians 15: 1-11*

Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain.

For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born.

For I am the least of the apostles and do not even deserve to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me was not without effect. No, I worked harder than all of them—yet not I, but the grace of God that was with me. Whether, then, it is I or they, this is what we preach, and this is what you believed.

GOSPEL LESSON

Mark 16: 1-8

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"

But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

"Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'"

Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.

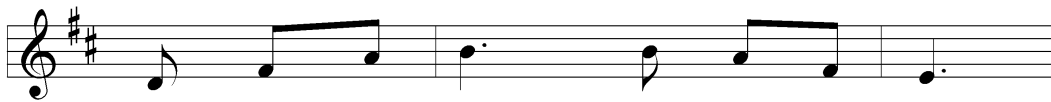

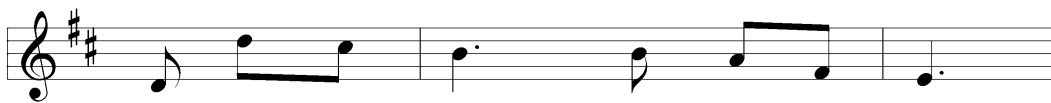

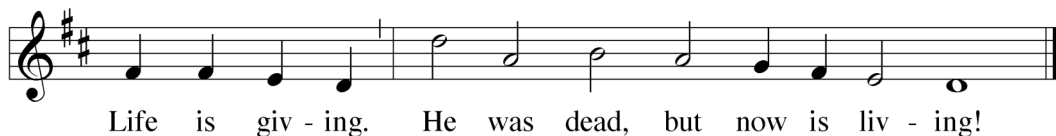

Daniel Dexter, a staff minister from Christ Our Redeemer Lutheran Church (WELS) in El Paso, TX, will be visiting Christ Lutheran Church with his “Scripture Storytelling.” Daniel memorizes books of the Bible and then shares them word-for-word in what he calls a ‘storytelling’ style. This isn’t a dry recitation, nor is it an actor’s performance. Daniel calls it a “living proclamation” that speaks to the listeners as participants, giving them a feel of what it may have been like to hear and see the words and works of God through the prophets and apostles. Daniel states: “A common encouragement I hear is that this storytelling makes the Bible come alive. But what I love about Scripture Storytelling, and the reason it’s so powerful to me also as I share it, is that God’s Word is alive, active and dynamic with God’s presence and power; I’m just putting that character of God’s Word on display in proclamation.” In our 5:00 pm worship service on Saturday, April 7, Daniel will share Jonah and Habakkuk and other portions of Scripture with the theme, Making Sense of a Sinful World. What should the church look like? Should it be filled with smiling faces? Should it be filled with people who have their lives together? Should it be completely devoid of sin and scandal? God certainly wants his people to be joyful and to lead pure and decent lives. The goal of the church is to “grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ.” However, we aren’t there yet. We’re still in a sinful, messy world. We’re still sinful, messy people. And yet we are still a part of the church. It stands to reason, then, that there is going to be some messiness in the church. In this sermon series we are going to accompany the Apostle Paul’s letter to the Christian church in Corinth to hear about the messiness of the church and the incredible grace of God that washes us all clean.

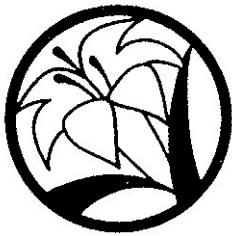
