## **Reformation Reflections**

Soon we will be celebrating the Reformation. On that day, we expect to sing the famous battle hymn of Dr. Martin Luther, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." This hymn is based on the well known words of Psalm 46, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear" (v. 1).

Luther knew about fear in uncertain times. This hymn was written sometime between 1527 to 1529. A lot was happening to Luther during those years. He had been excommunicated by the church and declared an outlaw by the emperor. The bubonic plague was now in his hometown of Wittenberg. His seven month old daughter, Elisabeth, had died. The Muslim armies were attacking Western Europe and the situation looked dire. Then there was the civil unrest and thousands of deaths in the Peasants' War that waged throughout Germany.

The times were uncertain. Luther did not know how his work to reform the church would turn out. During those years things looked pretty "messy." Various reformers argued amongst themselves. There was plenty of dividing rhetoric and hatred. There was, at times, violence. Luther could well have wondered: How will all this play out? He knew only that he must remain faithful to the Word.

It was clear that the world was changing. Changes in the political scene and in religious life were not only happening, there were the changes that came with the printing press and in science Copernicus maintained that the sun was at the center of the universe. A new world was emerging, the old way of life, in so many respects, was on the wane.

Here we are five hundred years later in uncertain and changing times. There is the pandemic. We have been sheltering for months. Our lives and our thinking is changing. Patience is growing thin. The "god" of science is not so clear on the issues of the day. Education is changing or being disrupted. Worship is happening in new forms. People are marching for racial change and governmental overhaul. A supreme court position needs to be filled. Our homes are now offices and classrooms. The rate of change in the last six months is unprecedented.

Something new is now emerging. We will not return to the world prior to COVID. There will be loss, and with that will come grief. We are believers in the Resurrection, that our God brings life out of death, something new out of the old. Yet this can be a painful process, especially while we are in the middle of it and do not have the vision to see how this will turn out.

Psalm 46 is a song of faith, "Nations are in uproar, kingdoms fall." It is a song of God's promises that are faithful then and now. Our God is a mighty fortress who fights by our side with weapons of the Spirit. Luther ends his hymn with, "And do what they will—hate, steal, hurt or kill—though all may be gone, our victory is won; the kingdom ours forever!"

We are in the middle of this new thing that God is bringing about. We can't see how this will play out. And we don't need to see how this will play out. We need to hear the Word of God and be open to the Spirit's direction. We are secure in the message that God is our refuge and strength. We can be bold in our witness to fight against evil and to invite more people into the way of Jesus, the way of grace and peace.

# COVID-19 Update

---

We continue to offer in person worship services: Saturday 5:00 pm, Sunday 8:00 and 10:30 am and Wednesday at noon. We will continue our Wednesday 6:00 pm outdoor service through October 14, weather permitting. The Lord's Supper is celebrated at each service. The total attendance at these services, since our opening on May 30, has been about 350. We are thankful that many have returned to worship, but we also stress that if you desire to worship with us at home at this time, God bless you in that decision. If you desire to worship with us in person, God bless you in that decision.

The online worship services continue as well as the daily devotionals. We hope and pray that many will continue to make the most of these opportunities to stay close to their Savior.

Following are some basic directives for our in person worship services.

- Doors propped open to limit the need to touch surfaces.
- Sanitizer stations at the church entrance.
- Frequent cleaning of high touchpoint areas and bathrooms between services.
- Offerings are to be received on the way in or out of the service in the wooden boxes in the gathering area.
- We can accommodate about 180 worshippers in the sanctuary and chapel - physically distanced.
- The service schedule will change as needed or warranted.
- Saturday evening services may be used for recording purposes. One or two cameras may be set up that will be focused on the pastor, not the congregation.

## General Procedures

- Hymnals and Bibles have been removed from the pews for the time being.
- Service bulletins are available for worship. Worshippers are encouraged to take them home or throw them away upon leaving church. No re-use of bulletins.
- Custodians/volunteers disinfect hard surfaces after worship.
- Trash receptacles are available.

- Please sit in designated pews to allow for social distancing. Worshippers are asked to stagger seating in pews, allowing at least 6 feet in between. Ushers should help in this regard.
- No formal fellowship time or food or drink. Worshippers are encouraged not to come too early. Outside fellowship is encouraged with plenty of space in the parking area.

## As a member, in Christian love, we ask you to:

- Please be prompt.
- Maintain social distance.
- Do not hug or shake hands.
- Wearing a mask is strongly encouraged for the health and safety of all our worshippers, until it is time to receive communion.
- Touch as little as possible to minimize risk for the next groups.
- Stay at home if you are sick.
- We encourage those in vulnerable categories to consider staying home as well.
- Use the restroom only if necessary.

## Communion

- Communion elements are prepared according to health recommendations: altar guild members wear mask and gloves.
- You will receive individual communion packets.
- Pastors and communion assistants wear masks and gloves as they distribute individual communion elements to you in the pews.
- The Lord's Supper is offered in all services.

## From Your Parish Nurses... Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)

Respiratory syncytial (sin-SISH-uhl) virus, or RSV, is a common respiratory virus that usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms. Most people recover in a week or two, but RSV can be serious, especially for infants and older adults. In fact, RSV is the most common cause of bronchiolitis (inflammation of the small airways in the lung) and pneumonia (infection of the lungs) in children younger than 1 year of age in the United States. It is also a significant cause of respiratory illness in older adults. Each year in the United States more than 57,000 children under 5 years old are hospitalized due to RSV infection. In addition, about 177,000 older adults are hospitalized annually with RSV and 14,000 of them die.

### Higher risk individuals for severe illness caused by RSV include:

- Young infants (<6 months of age)
- Premature babies
- Older adults 65 and over
- People with chronic lung disease or certain heart problems
- People with weakened immune symptoms

Call your health care provider if you or your child are having difficulty breathing, are not drinking enough fluids, or symptoms are growing worse.

RSV is most common during fall, winter, and spring. It can spread through coughing, and sneezing, touching surfaces with RSV on them and then touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Almost everyone gets RSV by the time they are 2 years old with healthy people usually experiencing mild symptoms and recovering on their own within a week or two.

### Prevent the spread of RSV:

- Wash hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds. Use hand sanitizer with 60% alcohol if water not available.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Avoid close contact with sick people.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces often.
- Stay home if sick.
