





## CONFESSION OF SINS AND FORGIVENESS

P: People of God, Adam and Eve were created to be holy, without sin. God's design focused on a life lived in perfect harmony with God's creation. But Adam and Eve sinned, and that harmony was broken. Because of their sin, we are born in sin and sin daily throughout our lives. We do not live as the Lord would have us live. Sin drives a barrier between God and his creation.

God does not wish for us to come under his judgment. Instead, he has provided us with the means to turn to him and be forgiven. The Holy Spirit moves us to confess our sins to God, to receive the free gift that is ours in and through his Son, Jesus Christ, and to receive forgiveness. Take a moment to contemplate your sins of this day and past days and confess them to your Lord.

## **SERMON TEXT**     *John 18: 4-11*

Jesus, knowing all that was going to happen to him, went out and asked them, “Who is it you want?”

“Jesus of Nazareth,” they replied.

“I am he,” Jesus said. (And Judas the traitor was standing there with them.) When Jesus said, “I am he,” they drew back and fell to the ground.

Again he asked them, “Who is it you want?”

“Jesus of Nazareth,” they said.

Jesus answered, “I told you that I am he. If you are looking for me, then let these men go.” This happened so that the words he had spoken would be fulfilled: “I have not lost one of those you gave me.”

Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it and struck the high priest’s servant, cutting off his right ear. (The servant’s name was Malchus.)

Jesus commanded Peter, “Put your sword away! Shall I not drink the cup the Father has given me?”


## CUSTODIAL / BUILDING CLEANING
