Tenebrae: On Good Friday, the church remembers the crucifixion of her Lord, Jesus Christ. Traditionally this day has been celebrated with a Tenebrae service. Tenebrae means "darkness." Our service tonight is not a message of gloom, but a service of adoration of the Son of God as he offers up his life as the Lamb of God.

Tonight you will notice the following parts of our Tenebrae worship:

- † A bare altar: Christ's abandonment before his passion.
- † Silence before the service: Time for quiet meditation.
- † Extinguishing of the candles: The suffering Jesus endured.
- † Disappearance of last candle: The moment of Jesus' death.
- † Loud sound at end of service: Death's power defeated.
- † Lighting of the last candle: Anticipates Jesus' resurrection.
- † The draping of the cross: Jesus' body removed and buried.
- † Silence after the service: Time for quiet reflection.

PRAYER: My Savior Jesus, when lost in sin, I could do nothing to please God. All my thoughts and actions were contaminated by a corrupted heart. But now your precious blood has cleansed my heart from all its sins. O my Savior, let me delight in those things that please God. Let not a foolish love for worldly goods and pleasures deprive me of this great blessing. Help me to see that this life has no nobler purpose than to serve the living God. Hear me for the sake of your bitter suffering and death, dear Savior. Amen.

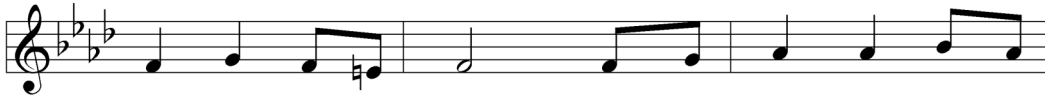

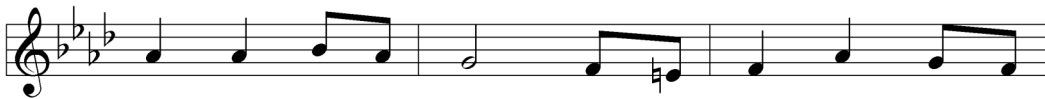

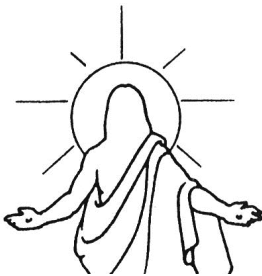

SCRIPTURE STORYTELLING

Saturday, April 7 at 5:00 pm

Daniel Dexter, a staff minister from Christ Our Redeemer Lutheran Church (WELS) in El Paso, TX, will be visiting Christ Lutheran Church with his “Scripture Storytelling.” Daniel memorizes books of the Bible and then shares them word-for-word in what he calls a ‘storytelling’ style. This isn’t a dry recitation, nor is it an actor’s performance. Daniel calls it a “living proclamation” that speaks to the listeners as participants, giving them a feel of what it may have been like to hear and see the words and works of God through the prophets and apostles. Daniel states: “A common encouragement I hear is that this storytelling makes the Bible come alive. But what I love about Scripture Storytelling, and the reason it’s so powerful to me also as I share it, is that God’s Word is alive, active and dynamic with God’s presence and power; I’m just putting that character of God’s Word on display in proclamation.” In our 5:00 pm worship service on Saturday, April 7, Daniel will share Jonah and Habakkuk and other portions of Scripture with the theme, Making Sense of a Sinful World.
