Don't Worry — Be Happy!

Since 2012 scholars have put together an ambitious global study called the World Happiness Report. Using various measures of “subjective well-being,” the study ranks different countries based on the happiness of the populations.

Happiness in the United States declined every year. “The U.S. has gotten a lot richer,” commented Jeffrey Sachs, one of the researchers, “but hasn’t gotten happier on most gauges.”

The 2021 report, covering the preceding year, focused on the impact of COVID-19. It chronicled increased suffering from the death of loved ones and the fear of death, from economic hardships, and unemployment, to loneliness due to isolation and social distancing. The report noted increased levels of sadness and poor mental health.

And yet, despite all the miseries of the pandemic year, worldwide, the measures for actual happiness and life satisfaction hardly changed at all. Even in America, the decline is at about the same rate it has been in years past, despite the extra travails of 2020.

Those who were happy before are still happy despite their additional hardships. “Many strands of data have been pieced together,” concluded the study, “to produce a picture of almost astonishing resilience.”

Evidently, suffering does not necessarily mean a reduction in happiness, which has more to do with a sense of meaning and satisfaction with one’s life.

People often look to status, wealth, power and fame in their pursuit of happiness. But as viewers who watched Oprah’s interview with members of Great Britain’s royal family discovered, even members of royalty—despite being at the top of the pecking order—sometimes struggle to capture happiness.

This is the message of Solomon in Ecclesiastes, as the old backsliding-but-repentant king looks back on his life. He tells of his successful pursuit of wealth, sex, pleasure, power and wisdom, only to find that they are vanity—meaningless, futile, unsatisfying—coming to this conclusion: “The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man” (Eccl. 12:13).

A Pew Research study found that 36% of people who are “actively religious” say that they are “very happy,” compared to 25% of the “inactively religious” and 25% of the “unaffiliated.”

And yet, it is a misconception to think that faith should always make us happy, or that if we are unhappy, there must be something wrong with our faith. Sensitive Christians are not always satisfied with their lives in this fallen world. Luther, for example, struggled with depression and was sometimes on the verge of despair. But his faith in Christ helped him bear his crosses and kept him focused on the joy that is promised in the world to come.

The times of happiness we do have here—being with people we love, experiences of beauty and joy, moments of satisfaction, feeling close to God—provide glimpses of that eternal happiness that awaits us in heaven.

Worship Updates

Basic Directives for Worship Services

- Sanitizer stations are at the church entrance.
- Offerings are received on the way in or out of the service in the boxes in the gathering area.
- Saturday services are used for video recording purposes. One or two cameras may be set up that will be focused on the pastor, not the congregation.
- As a member, in Christian love, we ask you to stay at home if you are sick.

General Procedures

- Service bulletins are available for worship. Take them home or recycle them upon leaving church.
- The two middle seating areas are open for normal seating. The side areas are spaced for social distancing. Ushers should help in this regard.
- Fellowship outdoors is encouraged with plenty of space in the parking area, weather permitting.

Communion

- You will receive individual communion packets.
- The Lord's Supper is offered in almost all services.
- Private Communion is always available upon request from your pastors, either at church, outside church, in your home, or wherever you wish to meet.

THE IMPORTANCE OF SUNDAY SCHOOL



When John the Baptist was born, those who attended the celebration of his birth and circumcision asked, "What then is this child going to be?" (Luke 1:66). That is a question every parent asks of his or her own child. Is my child going to be a doctor, lawyer, computer programmer, pastor or teacher? Is my child going to be successful, famous, wealthy?

These are important questions to consider. Because of questions like these, parents make difficult choices for their children, especially when it comes to education. We all want our children to get a good education so they can be properly equipped and prepared to successfully meet the challenges life will throw at them.

But the more important issue is—are our children properly prepared for the Kingdom of God?

When you think about it, Sunday School is the nursery of our church. For the Church to continue to exist and grow, it needs to train and care for the spiritual needs of its children.

Children need to know that God is the creator of all things. They need to know that all people are born sinners, condemned to eternal death. They need to know that Jesus Christ is the Son of God who has taken away their sins as well as the sins of the world. They need to know the stories of the Bible and the biographies of the saints put into writing by God himself, so they will have the complete knowledge of the history of God's plan of salvation. It is, after all, to our generation and the next that Christ has given the responsibility to pass along his gospel message.

Give your children the knowledge God wants them to have—the complete knowledge of their Savior Jesus Christ. BUILDING UPDATE

Development by the Planning Committee continues on the campus master plan. Work with our consultants continues on the improvements the congregation desired at the April listening sessions. Additional guidance on those improvements, including ideas for location and orientation, was provided for an amphitheater, a covered pavilion, a maintenance garage, walking trails, and a columbarium. The consultants will provide us with an understanding of the maximum buildable acreage beyond these facilities for potential future partner developments. Possible partner developments discussed include senior living, K-12 education, or other mission related uses.

Our focus is to discover new ways to support Christ's mission: "United in faith by the Word of God, we exist to praise, honor, and glorify Christ by joyfully nurturing lives for Christian service and sharing Christ with all." From Your Parish Nurses... “Back Pain”

Back pain is incredibly common in all age groups. It can last a few days or linger for years. You may have done too much yard work or just woke up with it and don't know what caused it.

Doctors used to prescribe bed rest for back pain. However, we now know that lying still is one of the worst things to do. Being inactive can actually make back pain worse and lead to other complications. It's important to get up and slowly start moving again.

For many, sleeping with back pain can be difficult and create a vicious cycle. When you don't get enough sleep, your muscles are tight and your back may feel worse. To encourage your spine in a neutral position when sleeping on your side, place a pillow between your knees. If sleeping on your back, slide a pillow under your knees.

When sitting, sit upright with your shoulders relaxed and your body supported against the back of your chair. Try putting a pillow or a rolled towel between your lower back and your seat. Keep your feet flat on the floor.

During a flare up, use ice on the painful areas to reduce pain and inflammation. Ice applications up to 20 minutes several times a day can be helpful.

Finally, exercise! Exercise has been found to be one of the most effective ways to relieve back pain quickly. Try gentle stretching, yoga, swimming, or walking. A strong core is one of the best ways to prevent more back pain in the future. Choose exercises that increase your strength, flexibility, and endurance. Gradually your back pain will decrease over time.
