## **The Greatest Gift**

*“These are the commands, decrees and laws the Lord your God directed me to teach you to observe ... so that you, your children and their children after them may fear the Lord your God.” Deuteronomy 1:1-2*

Every Christian parent has wondered: “What is the greatest gift I can give to my child?” Is it a well-rounded education? Then special effort is made to live in a community with good schools, to provide piano and dance lessons, sports activities, challenging academic courses, and the like. Is it a happy and pleasant childhood? Then special effort is made to spend quality time with your children, to create a home life with minimal stress and conflict, and planning for exciting family activities and vacations.

But isn't the greatest gift for your child the gift of Jesus? To let God's word of forgiveness in Jesus Christ be upon your heart as a parent so you, in turn, can impress that gospel on your children?

Unfortunately parents often fail to recognize the ongoing nature of Christian education. They think of it as a kind of “inoculation”—a one-time or short-term event that “exposes” their children to Christianity in the same way they may be exposed to chicken pox—to get it out of the way at an early age. Then, once they're exposed, we figure they've had their lifelong dosage and we have done our job as parents.

Years ago there was a newspaper story about a school bus driver who got lost driving a group of gifted children on an unfamiliar route. Frustrated, she returned to the school, dropped the students off at the front steps, and told them, “You're gifted—you figure out how to get home!” Fortunately, a woman living across the street invited the stranded children into her home to call their parents. “The kids were just floating around out there in the cold afternoon,” she said. “I couldn't just leave them out there like that.” Because of that experience, these children didn't want to ever ride the bus again.

A similar thing happens to children whose parents attempt “religious inoculation.” They are left stranded in the cold. These children are offered a short-term solution that delivers only short-term results. Once they grow up, they don't want to ride the religious bus anymore. What's the greatest gift you could ever give your child? It's not a religious inoculation, but a thorough and continuous Christian education! An education found only in the teaching of God's love for us in his Son Jesus.

Perhaps your child is well beyond the infant stage. Maybe you feel it is too late to start training them in faith. But it is never too late! As long as the Lord has given you that child's body and mind to love and care for, he has also given you that child's soul to nurture and strengthen in the faith. “I tell you now is the time of God's favor,” writes Paul, “now is the day of salvation” (2 Corinthians 6.2).

Long after we parents are gone and our children have raised their children and brought them to the baptismal font, nothing else will matter but that we here today have taught our young ones to know Jesus is their Savior from sin and death. Not the money we saved, the businesses we ran, the houses we lived in, or even the friends and memories we shared—none of that will matter. The only thing that will matter will be the gospel, the saving message of Jesus, that brings life to us and to our children. That is the greatest gift you can give your child—the gift of life, real life, in Jesus.

## Worship Updates

- The two middle seating areas are open for normal seating. The side areas are spaced for social distancing. Ushers should help in this regard.
- Fellowship outdoors is encouraged with plenty of space in the parking area, weather permitting.

- You will receive individual communion packets.
- The Lord's Supper is offered in almost all services.
- Private Communion is always available upon request from your pastors, either at church, outside church, in your home, or wherever you wish to meet.

# Apostles of Christ, Wauwatosa and Christ, Pewaukee Merger Update

The idea for a multi-site ministry with Apostles of Christ in Wauwatosa was first discussed in the Fall of 2019. At this time our member Pastor Larry Gates had just started as the vacancy pastor at Apostles. More than 30 members of Christ Pewaukee visited Apostles in November 2019 to better understand the current situation. In January 2020 the voting assembly at Christ Pewaukee directed our pastors and church leadership to develop a ministry plan to focus on opportunities to reach more people with the gospel of Christ with a multi-site ministry.

Though our work was delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the ministry plan was completed in the Fall of 2020 and presented to the voting assembly at Christ Pewaukee in January 2021. At this meeting, the leadership at Christ Pewaukee was authorized to pursue a merger of the two congregations. Our congregation felt that we could best serve the brothers and sisters of Apostles-Wauwatosa by proclaiming and supporting the gospel work together through a multi-site ministry. Our humble desire is to unite two campuses to do more kingdom work to the glory of God, and him alone. The merging of our church bodies was then also approved by the congregation at Apostles of Christ at a special voter's meeting on April 11, 2021. It was then approved by the voters of Christ on April 29, 2021.

A multi-site ministry has several advantages. Multi-site would allow the campuses to be served by current called workers of the gospel. Multi-site would allow the children of all three campuses (Pewaukee, Erin, Wauwatosa) access to Christ-centered Christian education through our tuition assistance program. Multi-site makes sense for evangelism, fellowship, and resource sharing (musicians, administration, bulletins, newsletter, website, etc.). Multi-site means everything is united... including the name. This will make sharing the gospel easier as we can highlight all three campuses under one name - Christ Lutheran—with campuses in Pewaukee, Wauwatosa, and Erin. The history will not be forgotten at each campus but will be celebrated to the glory of Christ. By God's grace, our growing footprint will provide called workers and members with ever increasing opportunities to bring others to faith in our Savior Jesus Christ.

Over the past several months, church leadership has made progress on many of the business aspects of the merger. Details of our multi-site ministry plan are being finalized, and we plan to begin preaching at Christ – Wauwatosa in October. Our merger work will be substantially completed by the next voter's meeting scheduled for October 28 in our Grand Hall. At this meeting, we will provide a detailed report of the work completed, officially welcome members from the Wauwatosa campus to our congregation, approve changes to our by-laws acknowledging the three campuses of our multi-site ministry, and approve the 2022 unified budget incorporating all three campuses.

My name is Lawrence (Larry) Gates. I was raised in Kenosha County and attended the public schools there. I graduated from high school in 1970. I then went into the United States Navy to learn electronics. I attended schools in Dam Neck Virginia to learn the fire control systems for the Fleet Ballistic Submarines. After school I was assigned to the U.S. Holland in Rota, Spain. I then was assigned to the U.S.S. Abraham Lincoln which was homeported in Hawaii and operated out of Guam. I made four tactical patrols and made my way up the ladder to become the leading petty officer of the Missile Control Center. It was during this time I found opportunity to read the Bible in depth and it was at this time the Lord moved me to get out of the navy and enter training to become a pastor. I attended college at Bethany Lutheran College in Mankato, Minnesota where I met my wife Kathy. I attended the seminary at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary in Mequon, Wisconsin. I vicared at First German in Manitowoc, Wisconsin. I graduated in 1984. I served churches in Peoria, Illinois and Wausau, Wisconsin. I then was assigned to Trinity in Waukesha. I served there for 25 years until my retirement in 2019. Since my retirement I have served as vacancy pastor at Apostles of Christ in Wauwatosa. I also serve as a chaplain to Lakeland hospital and Rehab facility in Waterford which serves brain and spinal cord injuries. I also served as a chaplain to Waukesha County Jail until covid. I married my wife Kathy in 1978 and the Lord blessed us with five children. I now have two grandchildren. I look forward to serving the shut-ins of Christ.

# September News

## Building on Faith

The Lord has blessed us with an incredible story. Our worship facility completed in 2006 and our building addition in 2020 have helped to dramatically change the landscape of our church and community. Over the past twenty years, the congregational support for our building projects have been demonstrated through the generous offerings made toward our Building Fund. At the same time, our members have continued with their regular offerings, recognizing the importance of supporting ongoing ministries and meeting every day operating expenses of our congregation. By God's grace we are truly a church that is *Building on Faith*.



In June 2016, by the grace of God, we retired the entire debt on our worship facility. Since that time, we added the expansion of our present facility. With this physical expansion we have been able to add new programs and opportunities to reach more souls with the gospel of Christ. The total cost of the new expansion was about \$8.5 million. Our present debt is now about \$5.1 million. With the mortgage in mind, and the need to continue growing in our regular giving, we have initiated our seventh three-year fund drive, called *Building on Faith*.

We are very pleased that Ron Morrow will be the Coordinator and that Jim Groth and Dan Hahn will be the Co-Chairmen of this stewardship program.

The *Building on Faith* challenge is to raise funds over and above our regular weekly offerings in order to make our monthly mortgage payments and pay down the principal to save on interest expense. ## From Your Parish Nurses... Diabetic Foot Care

About half of all people with diabetes have some kind of nerve damage. Nerve damage can lower your ability to feel pain, heat, or cold. Living without pain sounds pretty good, but it comes at a high cost. Pain is the body's way of telling you something's wrong so you can take care of yourself. If you don't feel pain in your feet, you may not notice a cut, blister, sore, or other problem. Small problems can become serious if they aren't treated early.

Check your feet every day for cuts, redness, swelling, sores, blisters, corns, calluses, or any other change to the skin or nails.

Wash your feet every day in warm (not hot) water. Don't soak your feet. Dry your feet completely and apply lotion to the top and bottom—but not between your toes, which could lead to infection.

Never go barefoot. Always wear shoes and socks or slippers, even inside, to avoid injury. Check that there aren't any pebbles or other objects inside your shoes and that the lining is smooth.

Wear shoes that fit well. For the best fit, try on new shoes at the end of the day when your feet tend to be largest. Always wear socks with your shoes.

Trim your toenails straight across and gently smooth any sharp edges with a nail file. Have your foot doctor (podiatrist) trim your toenails if you can't see or reach your feet.

Don't remove corns or calluses yourself, and especially don't use over-the-counter products to remove them—they could burn your skin.

Get your feet checked at every health care visit. Also, visit your foot doctor every year (more often if you have nerve damage) for a complete exam, which will include checking for feeling and blood flow in your feet.

Keep the blood flowing. Put your feet up when you're sitting, and wiggle your toes for a few minutes several times throughout the day.

Choose feet-friendly activities like walking, riding a bike, or swimming.

Be sure to ask your doctor what else you can do to keep your feet healthy.
