The Cancel Culture Cure

Isn't it ironic? Almost daily we hear about another celebrity, athlete, politician, or company that has offended somebody. Immediately the celebrity is blacklisted. The company is boycotted. TV shows are canceled.

Within hours, the offender releases a public apology. Talk show hosts and body language experts then dissect the apology so we can all judge whether they were truly sorry enough. The phenomenon happens so often today that has a name. We call it "Cancel Culture."

The irony of Cancel Culture is that it is driven by our society's almost obsessive need to be tolerant. Please don't misunderstand me. Tolerance can be a very good thing. God wants us to love all people. He wants us to treat each other with respect and understanding, even when we disagree with them or disapprove of their lifestyle choices.

The irony is that a society which is so preoccupied with tolerance has lost the ability to forgive. Jesus was sitting in the temple courts one day when the religious leaders dragged a woman toward him. "Teacher," they said, "this woman was caught in the act of adultery. In the Law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?"

Jesus bent over and began to draw in the dirt, but they continued to press him for an answer. So Jesus stood up, looked them in the eye and said, "If any one of you is without sin, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." He then bent over and began to draw in the dirt again. One by one, they each dropped their stones and walked away, until no one was left but the woman. Jesus looked up and asked, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" "No one, sir," she replied. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus told her. "Go now and leave your sinful life" (John 8:1-11).

Our society, the media, and even we ourselves are quick to pick up stones whenever we see other people commit real or even perceived offenses. We clamor, "Off with their heads!" when politicians from the other party do or say something which offends our moral sensibilities. We unfollow people on Instagram, cancel our NFL Season Pass, and stop eating at Chick-fil-A.

To be clear, I am not saying that people's actions shouldn't have consequences. I am also not saying we shouldn't point out bad behavior or stand up for what is right. What I am saying is watch your heart. Moral indignation is immoral. One of the reasons we are so quick to judge and cancel others is because it makes us feel better about ourselves.

We have all done things for which we are ashamed. We have all spoken without thinking. None of us has the right to throw even one stone. Thankfully we have a God and Savior who has not cancelled us. Instead, he showed us mercy. He was cancelled in our place and suffered shame on the cross. And because he did, we are forgiven.

In the end, this is what our Cancel Culture needs more of today. Forgiveness.

Basic Directives for Worship Services

- As a member, in Christian love, we ask you to stay at home if you are sick.

General Procedures

- Service bulletins are available for worship. Take them home or recycle them upon leaving church.
- The two middle seating areas are open for normal seating. The side areas are spaced for social distancing. Ushers should help in this regard.

Communion

- You will receive individual communion packets.
- The Lord's Supper is offered in almost all services.
- Private Communion is always available upon request from your pastors, either at church, outside church, in your home, or wherever you wish to meet.

Building on Faith Update

October will be a busy month for the *Building on Faith* Appeal. An Appeal Leadership Team, composed of roughly 15 members, has been formed and is coordinating the appeal. They have created letters, emails, and brochures that you will be receiving over the next several weeks to help make you an informed member of the congregation.

The purpose of our *Building on Faith* Appeal is two-fold: 1) To make our monthly mortgage payments and possibly prepay a portion of our loan principal. 2) To support our annual congregation expenses for 2022, including 100% of the new ministry programs and increased operating costs of our church.

In June 2016, we retired our entire debt by the grace of God. Since that time, we added the expansion of our present facility. With this physical expansion we have been able to add new programs and opportunities to reach more souls with the gospel of Christ. Our present debt is now about \$5.1 million. The total cost for the new expansion was about \$8.5 million. By God's grace and your participation in the *Building on Faith* Appeal we can continue to support the exciting changes taking place in our congregation and community.

A special Gathering Week will be held at all services on October 23-27 where we will celebrate the Lord's Blessing on our congregation. Everyone will receive a packet of information to help you pray and consider how the Lord may lead you to *Build on Faith* and generosity through the Appeal. From Your Parish Nurses... Need a Doctor?

There is no time like the present to find a primary care provider (PCP) if you do not have one. Selecting a PCP can be an important first step in managing your healthcare. A PCP could be a doctor, certified physician's assistant (PA-C), or a nurse practitioner (NP). Any of these types of providers can help keep you feeling well or control current medical problems.

A great place to start is finding a list of "In Network" providers. These would be individuals that accept your health insurance. From there, you want to pick a PCP that can meet your health needs. Most often you will want a provider who practices Internal Medicine, Family Practice, or General Medicine. For some older patients, a Geriatrician may be an option. Geriatricians specialize in the care of older patients.

Location is also something to consider. Finding a doctor that is near your home or work can make it easier to keep your regular office visits, or a same day appointment when problems arise. It is necessary to have a provider who will listen to your concerns and understand what is important to you. Choosing a doctor who speaks your own language and is sensitive to

your cultural needs and respects your personal convictions is key to having a good patient/doctor relationship. Asking a friend or family member is also a good way of finding possible recommendations for a provider in your area.

By establishing yourself with a primary care provider, you can get regular checkups. Some individuals need to be seen only yearly. However, if you have a chronic condition (asthma, hypertension, diabetes, etc.) or take prescription meds, you will likely need to be seen more often, especially if your condition is not under control. Regular checkups with your doctor can find hidden health concerns. Screening tests for cancer (colon, breast, skin) or immunizations can be addressed at these visits. Because of the Covid pandemic, many providers offer virtual visits. If that interests you, check to see if they are available.

Make your healthcare a priority and get established with a PCP today!

Apostles of Christ, Wauwatosa and Christ, Pewaukee Merger Update

The idea for a multi-site ministry with Apostles of Christ in Wauwatosa was first discussed in the Fall of 2019. At this time our member Pastor Larry Gates had just started as the vacancy pastor at Apostles. More than 30 members of Christ Pewaukee visited Apostles in November 2019 to better understand the current situation. In January 2020 the voting assembly at Christ Pewaukee directed our pastors and church leadership to develop a ministry plan to focus on opportunities to reach more people with the gospel of Christ with a multi-site ministry.

Though our work was delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the ministry plan was completed in the Fall of 2020 and presented to the voting assembly at Christ Pewaukee in January 2021. At this meeting, the leadership at Christ Pewaukee was authorized to pursue a merger of the two congregations. Our congregation felt that we could best serve the brothers and sisters of Apostles-Wauwatosa by proclaiming and supporting the gospel work together through a multi-site ministry. Our humble desire is to unite two campuses to do more kingdom work to the glory of God, and him alone. The merging of our church bodies was then also approved by the congregation at Apostles of Christ at a special voter's meeting on April 11, 2021. It was then approved by the voters of Christ on April 29, 2021.

A multi-site ministry has several advantages. Multi-site would allow the campuses to be served by current called workers of the gospel. Multi-site would allow the children of all three campuses (Pewaukee, Erin, Wauwatosa) access to Christ-centered Christian education through our tuition assistance program. Multi-site makes sense for evangelism, fellowship, and resource sharing (musicians, administration, bulletins, newsletter, website, etc.). Multi-site means everything is united... including the name. This will make sharing the gospel easier as we can highlight all three campuses under one name - Christ Lutheran—with campuses in Pewaukee, Wauwatosa, and Erin. The history will not be forgotten at each campus but will be celebrated to the glory of

Christ. By God's grace, our growing footprint will provide called workers and members with ever increasing opportunities to bring others to faith in our Savior Jesus Christ.

Over the past several months, church leadership has made progress on many of the business aspects of the merger. Details of our multi-site ministry plan are being finalized, and we plan to begin preaching at Christ – Wauwatosa in October. **The first worship service will be on October 4 and will continue to be held on Mondays at 1:00 pm.** Our merger work will be substantially completed by the next voter's meeting scheduled for October 28 in our Grand Hall. At this meeting, we will provide a detailed report of the work completed, officially welcome members from the Wauwatosa campus to our congregation, approve changes to our by-laws acknowledging the three campuses of our multi-site ministry, and approve the 2022 unified budget incorporating all three campuses.
