Bread of Life

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world." John 6:51

Thanksgiving is just around the corner. In short time families will sit around tables crowded by plates piled high with turkey, bowls filled with mashed potatoes and cranberries, and whatever other family favorites are traditionally served. But Thanksgiving celebrations will be different this year, there's a noticeably gloomy feel to it this time around. Elections are approaching, and this election cycle feels more divisive than at any other time except perhaps for the time just prior to the Civil War. A divisive, even hateful spirit permeates our land. Fearful reporting of COVID cases dominate the news cycle. Worries of new government mandates restricting people from gathering together hang over our heads. Worship life has been thrown into confusion and chaos. Service times have changed, the worship hour is shorter, the choir doesn't meet, Sunday school attendance has dropped dramatically, fewer people are found in the pews. We all wonder, "When will this craziness end?"

The height of Jesus' popularity in his ministry occurred when he miraculously fed the 5,000. Taking five small loaves of bread and two small fish, Jesus demonstrated his divine power, multiplying that little bit of food so that all who were there filled their bellies, and there was still food left over afterwards. But this wasn't simply a demonstration of Christ's divine power and proof that he was the Son of God. What both the crowd and Jesus' disciples experienced that day was a marvelous and incredible display of Jesus' love.

Sadly, Jesus' popularity was short-lived. The crowd wanted to be with Jesus, they didn't want Jesus to ever leave them, but their desire was misguided. They wanted Jesus in their life for one reason alone—to serve them as their bread king. Their hopes in Jesus were centered exclusively on their physical wants and needs.

Jesus came for a far greater purpose. He came from heaven and took upon himself our human flesh so he could give himself to us as heavenly food. By entering this wicked world in the same way every one of us have, born of a human mother, we come to know God in a way that none could ever imagine. Jesus came to supply himself as the food we need to eat in order to have life above and beyond this broken world. Those who feed on him will live with him in eternity.

How repugnant this sounds to our ears, and how crass are Jesus words! Yet how true his sermon is! Jesus' holy, pure, and unadulterated life in the flesh was lived for us. The life he lived was lived to replace the failed, sin-filled, selfish, faithless, and broken lives we live each day. The death he died in his flesh, the blood he shed on the cross, was offered to pay the penalty owed to the holy God for the world's sins.

Just as food is needed to sustain life in our bodies, and to provide them with the energy and good health necessary to perform our daily tasks, so food is also necessary needed to provide us with the life Jesus offers. But eating this heavenly food is not the same. Heavenly food is consumed by faith in Christ. An eternal life-giving faith feeds on all Christ had done to save us. It eats the wholesome words Christ speaks to us. In this way Jesus, the Bread of Life, nourishes us with himself so that we can have life with him now and forever.

The past few months have been hard and disappointing for us all. We don't know how many more months this may go on. But if we are feeding on Jesus, the Bread of Life, no matter what happens in this world, for us all is fine and good. Jesus invites us again, come, feed on me, take in my eternal life-giving word.

COVID-19 Update & News

We continue to offer in person worship services: Saturday 5:00 pm, Sunday 8:00 and 10:30 am and Wednesday at noon. We will continue our Wednesday evening services at 6:30 pm in November. The Lord's Supper is celebrated at each service. We are thankful that many have returned to worship, but we also stress that if you desire to worship with us at home at this time, God bless you in that decision. If you desire to worship with us in person, God bless you in that decision.

The online worship services continue as well as the daily devotionals. We hope and pray that many will continue to make the most of these opportunities to stay close to their Savior.

Following are some basic directives for our in person worship services.

- Doors propped open to limit touched surfaces.
- Sanitizer stations at the church entrance.
- Frequent cleaning of high touchpoint areas and bathrooms.
- Offerings are received on the way in or out of the service in the boxes in the gathering area.
- We can accommodate about 180 worshippers in the sanctuary and chapel - physically distanced.
- The service schedule will change as needed or warranted.
- Saturday evening services may be used for recording purposes. One or two cameras may be set up that will be focused on the pastor, not the congregation.

General Procedures

- Hymnals and Bibles have been removed from the pews for the time being.
- Service bulletins are available for worship. Worshippers are encouraged to take them home or throw them away upon leaving church.
- Custodians/volunteers disinfect hard surfaces after worship.
- Trash receptacles are available.
- Please sit in designated pews to allow for social distancing. Worshippers are asked to stagger seating in pews, allowing at least 6 feet in between. Ushers should help in this regard.
- No formal fellowship time or food or drink. Worshippers are encouraged not to come too early. Outside fellowship is encouraged with plenty of space in the parking area.

As a member, in Christian love, we ask you to:

- Please be prompt.
- Maintain social distance.
- Do not hug or shake hands.
- Wearing a mask is strongly encouraged for the health and safety of all our worshippers, until it is time to receive communion.
- Touch as little as possible to minimize risk for the next groups.
- Stay at home if you are sick.
- We encourage those in vulnerable categories to consider staying home as well.
- Use the restroom only if necessary.

Communion

- Communion elements are prepared according to health recommendations: altar guild members wear mask and gloves.
- You will receive individual communion packets.
- Pastors and communion assistants wear masks and gloves as they distribute individual communion elements to you in the pews.
- The Lord's Supper is offered in all services.

"Anxiety, Stress, & Resiliency — Back to School and COVID-19" will be presented on November 8 by Karen Fischer, a Wisconsin Licensed Professional Counselor from WLCFS-Christian Family Solutions. "Back to school" doesn't mean the same thing this year. What are we going back to? Parenting comes with a new set of difficulties to navigate in this crisis and with less resources to lean on. Balance has struggled to be recalibrated. Emotions appear to be unmanageable. Learn how to reinterpret the tasks of the day and apply peaceful parenting to bring more intentionality and calm to your family at this time.

"How to Help a Depressed or Suicidal Friend" will be offered on November 15. Understanding how to approach a depressed or suicidal friend can be challenging. You want to be supportive, but you are unsure about what you can say or do to improve the situation. Through this presentation, given by Sarah Reik of Christian Family Solutions, you will learn specific ways you can care for your friends and yourself. These resources will help you better identify the causes of depression, recognize the warning signs for suicide, and determine how you can help.

"Being a Christian Kid in the Electronic Age" will be presented on November 22 by Laura Reinke, Marriage & Family Therapist. With technology advancing so rapidly, and some children attending virtual school all day, it can be difficult for parents to understand everything their children are experiencing online. Through this presentation, parents will learn more about the impact technology has on children. Using biblical truths and evidence-based techniques, counselor Laura Reinke will provide guidance for parents navigating the digital age in their household.

Pastor Warnecke, as outreach pastor, is using the activities to present God's Word through short devotions. Small follow-up warranty items for the addition continue to be handled. Furnishings, primarily for the kitchen, continue to be placed. From Your Parish Nurses... Talking to Your Kids about Drugs and Alcohol

Parents do have a significant influence in their children's decisions to experiment with alcohol and other drugs. One of the most influential factors during a child's adolescence is maintaining a strong, open relationship with a parent. When parents create a supportive and nurturing environment, children make better decisions. Studies show that teens are less likely to abuse substances if their families have open, honest discussions about the matter.

It is never too early to talk with your children about alcohol and other drugs. About 10% of 12-year-olds say they have tried alcohol, but by age 15, that number jumps to 50%. Additionally, almost 70% of high school students will have tried alcohol, half will have taken an illegal drug and more than 20% will have used a prescription drug for a nonmedical purpose. The sooner you talk to your children about alcohol and other drugs, the greater chance you have of influencing their decisions about drinking and substance abuse.

It isn't always easy knowing how to talk to your children about this subject. Here are some tips for you to get started:

Ask them what they know about drugs and alcohol. There's a chance they know a thing or two already. Find out how much they know and build from there. Making it a two-way conversation will prevent it from seeming like a lecture.

Tell them the serious risks associated with drug and alcohol use. They will benefit knowing that using alcohol and drugs irresponsibly can send them to the hospital, get them kicked out of school, or land them in jail.

Warn them about peer pressure. Around half of first-time substance use is because of a peer's suggestion. Help them identify common peer pressure situations, such as parties, and how to respectfully decline the offer. Teenagers may be worried about saying "no" and having their social standing be at risk. Tell them that people who think for themselves and stand their ground demand respect from their peers.

Set clear expectations with your kids. Establish rules about substance use and lay out punishments loud and clear for breaking these rules. Without supervision, kids are more likely to drink, smoke, or try drugs. In homes where parents monitor their children's activities and enforce rules, the children have a lower rate of experimentation and addiction.

Let your kids know they can come to you any time they have a problem or concerns. Continue to have these conversations as your children grow into teens and progress through school. Each year the temptation to experiment often grows, along with the availability and variety of harmful substances. Continue to educate them on what they'll encounter and how to handle various scenarios.
