ITINERARY

Monday, October 12

Depart Pewaukee via motorcoach for Chicago O'Hare International Airport for departing flights.

Tuesday, October 13 (D)

Arrival EDINBURGH, SCOTLAND.

After customs formalities and claiming our luggage, we proceed into the city of Edinburgh for a panoramic tour and time for lunch on our own and some shopping. We also plan a visit to the Royal Yacht Brittania, decommissioned in 1997, but available now for touring. Dinner at our hotel this evening.

Wednesday, October 14 (B, D)

After breakfast, we enjoy a full day of touring in Edinburgh. We begin with a visit and tour of EDINBURGH CASTLE. The castle stands atop Castle Rock, towering over the town, and had long been a royal residence and military fortress. After some free time we next follow our guide into the underground vaults below street level in Old Town. We will explore the passageways and learn why the vaults were built, getting insight into city life in the 18th century. This evening we will enjoy dinner and show at "SPIRIT OF SCOTLAND." The dinner will include traditional Scottish foods, and you will be entertained with music and a blend of stories, dance, prose and poetry celebrating centuries of Scottish life.

Thursday, October 15 (B, D)

Following breakfast, we embark on a full day tour to the Scottish Highlands, see the mysterious Loch Ness and ancient Urquhart Castle, and enjoy the scenery of Glencoe and Inverness. We return to Edinburgh for dinner at a local restaurant this evening.

Friday, October 16 (B, D)

Today we enjoy a full day tour traveling north again, this time via the Firth of Forth (an inlet of the North Sea) to the seaside town of St. Andrews. We have a guided tour of the city with a visit to the ruins of St. Andrews Castle, and explore the history of golf at the R&A World Golf Museum. We will have plenty of time for lunch on our own, and shopping before heading back to Edinburgh. Dinner at our hotel this evening.

Saturday, October 17 (B, D)

We depart Edinburgh this morning and travel south, with stops this afternoon in the Yorkshire Dales region. The region is well known because of James Herriott's books and the television series "All Creatures Great and Small" which describes his life as a country veterinary surgeon. We will stop in the town of Thirsk to visit his museum. There will be time for lunch and shopping in this quaint area, and we will enjoy the picturesque scenery on our way to York, where we will stay this evening. Dinner will be at our hotel.

Sunday, October 18 (B, D)

This morning, we will visit some sites in York of importance to the Wars of the Roses (1455-1485), as well as the Restoration of the monarchy following the Commonwealth period (1649-1660). Next, we travel south where we spend some time in Stratford-upon-Avon, birthplace of Shakespeare. We will visit his birth house, and then have some free time for lunch and shopping. You may want to visit Anne Hathaway's Cottage or Trinity Church on your own. We continue south to the capitol city of London for our four-night stay. Dinner at our hotel tonight.

Monday, October 19 (B, D)

After breakfast, we begin a day of touring with a visit to Westminster Abbey. Next we admire the Houses of Parliament with Big Ben. On to Buckingham Palace, and then continue to Trafalgar Square and St. Paul's Cathedral. The morning ends near Hyde Park for some free time for lunch on our own. This afternoon we visit the Tower of London. Construction began in 1078, at the direction of William the Conqueror. Built as protection from attack from the River Thames estuary to the east, this fortress has served as a protective castle, prison, Royal palace, site of the Royal Zoo, and the site of many executions. Dinner at a local restaurant near the hotel tonight.

Tuesday, October 20 (B, D)

Today's touring includes a visit to the Churchill War Rooms near St.James Park. Next we visit the Banqueting House, last remaining portion of the Palace of Whitehall built by King Henry VIII, and site of the execution of King Charles I. Next it is on to Windsor, southwest of London, where we visit Windsor Castle, and the St. George's Chapel. Dinner at a local restaurant.

Wednesday, October 21 (B).

Today we have no included activities scheduled, to allow you a free day for optional sightseeing tours; some places to consider in London: British Museum, Covent Garden, Madame Tussaud, Transport Museum, Harrod's Department Store, Warner Brothers' Studio (Tour about the making of Harry Potter), walk across and inside the Tower Bridge. Options outside of London: Stonehenge, Bath, Canterbury, and Dover. Farewell dinner this evening

Thursday, October 22 (B).

Transfer this morning to London Heathrow Airport for our flight back to the USA. We end our travels with the motorcoach ride back to Pewaukee.
