



SERMON TEXT *Mark 14: 1-9*

Now the Passover and the Festival of Unleavened Bread were only two days away, and the chief priests and the teachers of the law were scheming to arrest Jesus secretly and kill him. “But not during the festival,” they said, “or the people may riot.”

While he was in Bethany, reclining at the table in the home of Simon the Leper, a woman came with an alabaster jar of very expensive perfume, made of pure nard. She broke the jar and poured the perfume on his head.

Some of those present were saying indignantly to one another, “Why this waste of perfume? It could have been sold for more than a year’s wages and the money given to the poor.” And they rebuked her harshly.

“Leave her alone,” said Jesus. “Why are you bothering her? She has done a beautiful thing to me. The poor you will always have with you, and you can help them any time you want. But you will not always have me. She did what she could. She poured perfume on my body beforehand to prepare for my burial. Truly I tell you, wherever the gospel is preached throughout the world, what she has done will also be told, in memory of her.”

SCRIPTURE STORYTELLING on Saturday, April 7 at 5:00 pm

Daniel Dexter, a staff minister from Christ Our Redeemer Lutheran Church (WELS) in El Paso, TX, will be visiting Christ Lutheran Church with his “Scripture Storytelling.” Daniel memorizes books of the Bible and then shares them word-for-word in what he calls a ‘storytelling’ style. This isn’t a dry recitation, nor is it an actor’s performance. Daniel calls it a “living proclamation” that speaks to the listeners as participants, giving them a feel of what it may have been like to hear and see the words and works of God through the prophets and apostles. Daniel states: “A common encouragement I hear is that this storytelling makes the Bible come alive. But what I love about Scripture Storytelling, and the reason it’s so powerful to me also as I share it, is that God’s Word is alive, active and dynamic with God’s presence and power; I’m just putting that character of God’s Word on display in proclamation.” In our 5:00 pm worship service on Saturday, April 7, Daniel will share Jonah and Habakkuk and other portions of Scripture with the theme, Making Sense of a Sinful World. A door offering will be received to help defray Dan’s expenses. Invite friends and come and hear God’s Word in this unique way!




Maundy Thursday Worship & Refreshments: On Thursday, March 29 our Maundy Thursday worship services with the Lord's Supper will be held at 12:00 pm and 7:00 pm. Following the evening service, all are welcome to join us for refreshments.

Good Friday Worship: Good Friday worship services will be held Friday, March 30 at 12:00 pm and 7:00 pm. The evening worship, our annual Tenebrae service, will be completely different than our noon service. Tenebrae is the Latin word for darkness. The terrible darkness that marked that first Good Friday is symbolized as the church is darkened during the course of the service while we meditate on Jesus' seven words spoken from the cross.



Holy Saturday Vigil Worship: Holy Saturday worship will be held Saturday, March 31 at 5:00 pm. Join us as we wait in expectant anticipation of Jesus' resurrection.



Easter Sunrise Worship: This early morning Easter worship service with the Lord's Supper will begin at 6:30 am on Sunday, April 1 and will be completely different from our later services.

Easter Festival Worship: Our later Easter morning services with the Lord's Supper will begin at 8:00 am and 10:30 am on Sunday, April 1. These special services will focus on the glorious resurrection of our Savior in Word and song led by our choirs.
